Rainier Youth Choirs has grown substantially since inception in 2007 when our membership totaled 63 in three ensembles with two directors and a budget of \$35,000. Ten years later, we are just short of 100 singers in six ensembles under four directors with a budget over \$100,000. An average of about 55 songs per season have been performed for appreciative audiences, from Washington to Hawaii, New York City to Oregon, and in a few weeks, to Ireland!

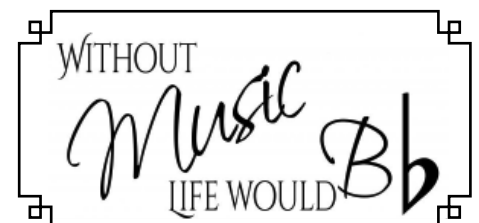
AMY BALLARD, Director, Bella Voce, is the choral director at Bonney Lake HS in the Sumner School District. Mrs. Ballard regularly judges large group and solo/ensemble contests throughout the state and sings with the Tacoma Symphony Chorus. In 2010, Mrs. Ballard received recognition as the "Most Outstanding Young Choral Educator of the Year" by the Washington State ACDA. She is currently the President for the Valley Region WMEA and the NW ACDA Women's Honor Choir Chair.

Amy enjoys teaching private voice and piano lessons to local students. She is an accomplished pianist as well as a fine singer/soprano soloist, and toured Europe as accompanist for the Washington Ambassadors of Music Chorus the summer of 2016.

KAREN MARTIN, Director, Vocina, is the general music specialist at Kent Elementary. LEORA SCHWITTERS, Artistic Director/ Founder, Director, Young Women's Ensemble, Consonare and Colla Voce, retired from Cedar Heights Middle School (Kent) after 25 years of teaching K-12 choral, instrumental, and general music in the public schools of South Dakota, Wyoming and Washington. As Past-President of the Washington State American Choral Director's Association (WA-ACDA), she received their 2014 Leadership Award. Her Cedar Heights choirs performed in state and regional conferences for the Washington Music Educators Association and ACDA. Active as a clinician and adjudicator, Leora has also served on the board of the Tahoma Chapter of the National Association of Teachers of Singing (NATS), has presided over the Green River Music Educators Association and conducted the 2014 WMEA Junior All State Choir. She sings soprano in Chor Anno and the Lyric Arts Ensemble. She and her husband Larry enjoy trail running and are avid birders.

KAREN FULMER, Executive Director, retired from the Sumner School District after teaching choral music for 31 years at the junior high and high school levels and serving as district Music Coordinator. Choirs under her direction consistently earned high scores at area contests and assisted in workshop presentations for the WMEA and ACDA. Currently serving as national Vice President of the 20,000-member ACDA, Karen previously held the offices of Washington State and Northwestern Division president. She was named the 1997 Washington State Teacher of the Year for all subject areas. Karen was a founding board member and singer in the adult community choirs, Northwest Repertory Singers and Chor Anno. She also sings in Choral Union

at PLU, having toured internationally with them three times. Karen regularly adjudicates throughout the US and Canada. She has conducted state honor choirs in Wisconsin and Minnesota, the 2015 WMEA Junior All State Choir and the 2015 WWU High School Women's Festival. Karen and her husband Rich enjoy family activities, especially at their lake cabin near Spokane.

BRIAN HOSKINS, Director, Young Men's Ensemble, Consonare, Brian Hoskins is the choral director at Nelsen Middle School and Lindbergh High School in Renton and is a two time recipient of the "Ahead of the Class: Excellence in Teaching Award" presented by the Renton Chamber of Commerce. Brian's NMS choir premiered several works from local and national composers and sang for the regional conference of NW ACDA in 2012. In New York, Brian was the Intermediate Chorus Conductor for the Young People's Chorus (YPC) of New York City.

An accomplished pianist, Mr. Hoskins is in demand as an accompanist. In July 2004, Brian had the honor of performing with and accompanying the Young Men's Chorus and Concert Chorus of YPC in the Gold Medal winning performances at the World Choral Olympics in Germany. Brian is also featured playing the Hammond-XK2 on three albums with Seattle folk artist Wes Weddell. He performs on electric bass with his own band 'Mixed Bag' and with the Wes Weddell 'Super Band' year round, sings in and accompanies Chor Anno.

He served on the WA-ACDA board as the Chair for Multicultural Music, is Past-President of the Soundview Music Region, and has conducted various regional MEA Honor Choirs.
